These foundations highlight the College's strategic direction for 2008 – 2010 and will act to guide the collective actions of all Campuses and work units.

Foundation One: Seamless Education Pathway from PrePrep to TAFE

- Implement a sustainable and effective curriculum leadership structure at both Campus and College levels
- Implement systemic syllabus and curriculum reforms to enhance the quality of educational delivery in the Torres Strait
- Develop contextualized curriculum activities and resources which reflect the unique context of the Torres Strait
- Work in partnership with Tropical North Queensland Institute of TAFE to deliver vocational education and training programs relevant for the Torres Strait
- Reinforce a culture of school transparency of student achievement reporting

Foundation Two: Proactive Student Services

- Implement proactive & outreach services for all students
- Develop a model of increased flexibility of instruction to ensure all students are engaged in at least 1000 hours of quality learning experiences each year
